

The Iron Man

Daily activities, homework activities, vocabulary and questions.

Chapter 1 - Day 1 (to p3 'Nobody knew the Iron Man had fallen')

Classroom activity: Draw the scene on the beach after the Iron Man had fallen off the cliff.

Homework activity: Determine the important points from what we read today under the headings, 'Characters', 'Setting', 'Main Events'

Vocabulary: brink, snag, booming, scattered

Chapter 1 - Day 2 (to p7 '..as the sun rose over the sea and the day came.')

Classroom activity: Draw a picture of the Iron Man searching for his head. Choose a sentence from the text to accompany the picture.

Homework activity: Write in the correct order, how the Iron Man put himself back together.

Vocabulary: peering, fastened, torso, trio, dragging

Chapter 1 - Day 3 (to end of p8)

Classroom activity: Draw an image of the Iron Man wading into the sea. Write an explanation as to why he is doing this. /Write three adjectives describing the Iron Man, justify why you chose each one.

Homework activity: Write a list of 'I wonder' questions you have after chapter 1.

Vocabulary: ledge, to and fro, blazed, swell, breakers

Chapter 1

- 1) What does the following sentence mean? 'The wind sang through his iron fingers.'
- 2) Why were his eyes shining different colours?

- 7) Why did the Iron Man walk into the sea?

Chapter 2 - Day 4 (to p13 'His feet will have left track in the earth')

Classroom activity: Write a brief news report on what we read today. (Don't forget to answer the 5W and 1H questions)

Homework activity: Your name is Hogarth. Write a diary entry about what happened today.

Vocabulary: gasping, twilight, inland

Chapter 2 - Day 5 (to p16 'The Iron Man had gone back into the sea')

Classroom activity: Illustrate what happened the machinery.

Homework activity: Write a short newspaper report on what happened today.

Vocabulary: carved, bolted, clanging, clattering, toppled

Chapter 2 - Day 6 (to p19 '..to warn people away and they left it at that.')

Classroom activity: The farmers plan did not work. Write out your own plan on how to catch the Iron Man. Illustrate your plan.

Homework activity: The Iron Man does not appear in what we read today, he had not been seen for days. Write a paragraph explaining where he was, what he was doing and why.

Vocabulary: stupendous, enormous, colossal, reckoned, bulldozer

Chapter 2 - Day 7 (to p23 “We’ve caught the Iron Giant.”)

Classroom activity: Make a menu (including a starter, main course and dessert) for the Iron Man. Illustrate and label.

Homework activity: Write a diary entry as Hogarth. Include how you are feeling as you describe what happened.

Vocabulary: wondering, wandering, looming, struggled

Chapter 2 - Day 8 (to end of p24)

Classroom activity: Make a list of the feelings felt by the all characters today. Use a sentence to explain why they felt each of these emotions.

Homework activity: Determining Importance- use the headings previously used and choose a main event from each page from the chapter.

Vocabulary: glared, whirling, cogs, mound

Classroom activity: Draw the picnic the family put out on the tablecloth. Include all the details mentioned.

Homework activity: Write a news report on what we read today.

Vocabulary: unfurled, jolt, jagged, groping

Chapter 3 - Day 10 (to end of chapter)

Classroom activity: Write an acrostic poem on Hogarth

Homework activity: Determining importance- Use the headings and write a main event for each page.

Vocabulary: dense, deceive, boughs, delicacies

Homework activity: Crystal ball-Look into the future and draw what you think will happen in the crystal ball. Explain what you see in the future.

Vocabulary: peering, astronomers, wriggling, gloomy

Chapter 4 - Day 12 (to end of p42)

Classroom activity: You are a photographer from a local newspaper. Draw the photo you took of the creature and write a headline to go with the picture.

Homework activity: Imagine the creature could not talk. Instead it had a note attached to its neck. In the note it explains where it came from and what it is doing on earth. Write what you think it would say in the note.

Vocabulary: silhouette, immense, trailing, monstrosity, charred.

Chapter 4 - Day 13 (to p45 '...staring out over all the countries of the world.')

Classroom activity: Character web- Draw the creature in the middle of the page. Write adjectives describing him around the picture. Choose three of your adjectives and write a sentence for each from the text that you think show this characteristic.

Homework activity: Come up with a plan to defeat the creature. Illustrate your plan.

Vocabulary: vast, combined, operation, drifted, utmost, lament.

Chapter 4 - Day 14 (to end of chapter)

Classroom activity: Crystal ball activity.

Homework activity: Write a paragraph explaining the Iron Man's plan.

Vocabulary: titbit, grinding, stupendous.

Classroom activity: Crystal ball

Homework activity: Write an acrostic poem on the Iron Man.

Vocabulary: wizened, scorched, crest, limply, blunt, billowed, furnace.

Chapter 5 - Day 17 (to end of p58)

Classroom activity: You took a photo of the creature after he landed. Draw the photo and include a sentence from the text to go with it.

Homework activity: Write some 'I wonder questions' you might have (at least five).

Vocabulary: singeing, colossal, writhing, sprawled, signalled

Chapter 45- Day 18 (to end)

Classroom activity: Write a diary entry as the Iron Man/creature.

Homework activity: Write a headline and a short newspaper report on what happened today. Don't forget to include a photo.

Vocabulary: wheezing, weeping, submit, plunged, drooped, tremendous, squabbles.
