# History of the EU

The EU was not always as big as it is today. It was created in the aftermath of the Second World War. The first steps were to foster economic cooperation; the idea being that countries who trade with one another become economically interdependent and so more likely to avoid conflict.

When European countries first started to cooperate economically in 1951, only Belgium, Germany, France, Italy, Luxembourg and the Netherlands participated.

# History of the EU

The European Economic Community (EEC) started in 1957 with Belgium, Germany, France, Italy, Luxembourg and the Netherlands as its first members.

Over time, it gained 22 new members and changed its name twice: first to the European Community (EC) and then to the European Union (EU).

Several countries, including Albania, Montenegro, Serbia, Macedonia and Turkey wish to join the EU.

# The EU

The EU flag consists of a circle of 12 gold stars on a blue background. The number of stars has nothing to do with the number of member countries, though the circle is a symbol of unity.

# BREXIT

The word "Brexit" comes from a combination of the words "Britain" and "Exit". In 2016, the people of the UK voted by a majority in a referendum to leave the EU.

This will be the first time a country has left the EU. The UK is scheduled to leave the EU on Friday March 29th, 2019.

# Rights of EU Citizens

Under EU laws, citizens of all EU countries have certain rights. These include the right to move freely around member states of the EU, the right to live, work and study in member states.

EU citizens are also free to trade and transport goods and services within the EU.

Citizens also have the right to vote on elections to the European Parliament.

# EU Stats

- The EU started in 1957
- It started with 6 countries and now has 28
- The flag of the EU has a circle of 12 yellow stars on a blue background
- There are over 500 million people living in the EU
- People in the EU speak 24 different official languages, including Gaeilge
- The European Parliament has 751 members, elected by citizens of the EU

# EU Stats

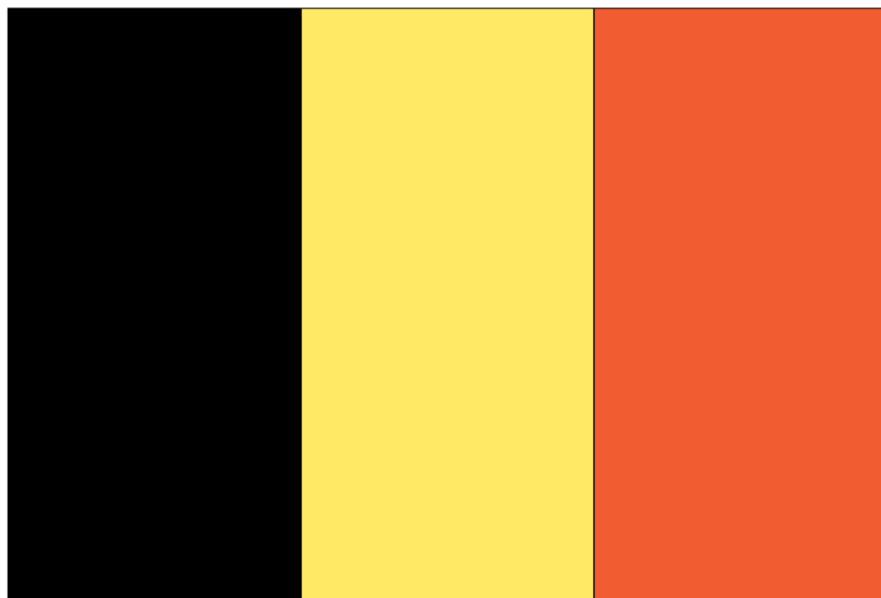
- The Euro was introduced in 2002 as the currency of the EU
- 19 of the 28 EU member states are members of the Eurozone
- The EU is run from institutions in Brussels, Luxembourg and Strasbourg
- "United in Diversity" is the motto of the European Union
- "Ode to Joy" is the official anthem of the European Union
- The EU celebrates its birthday every year on May 9th
