



Ada Lovelace




Ada Lovelace

Ada Lovelace was very interested in mathematics. She is believed to have written the first published computer programme. In 1979, a computer programming language, Ada, was named after her.

Alan Turing

Alan Turing was an English mathematician and computer pioneer. He contributed to the development of early electronic digital computers. During World War II, he helped to crack German codes.

Albert Einstein

Albert Einstein is one of the most famous scientists in the world. He was a physicist who developed theories on matter and energy. His theories of relativity were groundbreaking at the time – even if they were hard to understand!

Alexander Graham Bell



Alexander Graham Bell

Alexander Graham Bell was a Scottish-born inventor and educator of deaf children. He is best known as the inventor of the telephone in 1876, which allowed speech to be transmitted electronically for the first time.

Betty Holberton was one of the six original programmers of the first general-purpose electronic digital computer, ENIAC, for the US army in the 1940s. Later, she helped to create computer languages used to operate computers.

Bill Gates




Bill Gates

Bill Gates is best known as the co-founder of Microsoft which developed computer software, electronics and PCs, beginning in the 1980s and 1990s. After leaving Microsoft, he set up charities to share some of his wealth.

Charles Darwin



Charles Darwin

Charles Darwin was an English naturalist, geologist and biologist, best known for his contributions to the science of evolution. He believed that all species of life had evolved from a common ancestor, a theory that is now widely accepted.

1473 - 1543



Nicolaus Copernicus



Nicolaus Copernicus

Nicolaus Copernicus was a Polish mathematician and astronomer who developed the theory that the earth is a moving planet. He believed that the Earth and other planets revolve around the sun, which was a groundbreaking theory at the time.

1564 - 1642



Galileo Galilei



Galileo Galilei

Galileo Galilei was an Italian astronomer whom many consider to be the father of modern science. Although he did not invent the refracting telescope, he developed and improved it significantly. He also discovered Jupiter's moons.

1877 - 1963



Garret Morgan



Garret Morgan

Garret Morgan was an African American inventor. He is best known for developing a smoke hood which became the prototype for gas masks used during World War I. He also developed a three-position traffic signal in the 1920s.

George Washington Carver



George Washington Carver

George Washington Carver was an American agricultural scientist. He is well known for developing hundreds of products from peanuts including face powder, ink and soap. He also promoted the idea of crop rotation to assist soil regeneration.

Isaac Newton



Isaac Newton

Isaac Newton was an English scientist, astronomer and mathematician. He developed theories on light and colour and a branch of mathematics called Calculus. He is also well known for developing theories on gravity and motion.

Louis Pasteur




Louis Pasteur

Louis Pasteur was a French chemist and microbiologist. He is best known for discovering pasteurisation, the process of gently heating and cooling a liquid eg. beer, milk, wine in order to kill the bacteria present in the liquid.

Margaret Hamilton



Margaret Hamilton

Margaret Hamilton is an American computer scientist. She is best known for developing the guidance and navigation systems for NASA's Apollo space programme, which allowed Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin to land on the moon.

1867 - 1934



Marie Curie



Marie Curie

Marie Curie was a Polish-born French physicist best known for her research on radioactivity. She won two Nobel Prizes — one in physics and one in chemistry. She is also known for her discovery of Polonium and Radium.

Famous Scientists/Inventors

1943 - 2020



Mario Molina



Mario Molina

Mario Molina was a Mexican chemist. He was a co-winner of the 1995 Nobel Prize in Chemistry for his role in discovering the threat to the Earth's Ozone Layer from CFC (chlorofluorocarbon) gases which were used in aerosol cans and fridges.

Nikola Tesla



Nikola Tesla

Nikola Tesla was a Serbian-American inventor and electrical engineer. He developed the first alternating current (AC) motor which is still used in many electric power operations all around the world. He also experimented with wireless control.

Famous Scientists/Inventors

1765 - 1815



Robert Fulton



Robert Fulton

Robert Fulton was an American engineer and inventor who is credited with developing the world's first commercially successful steamboat. He also worked on the development of the submarine, the torpedo and steam-powered warships.

Famous Scientists/Inventors

1791 - 1872



Samuel Morse



Samuel Morse

Samuel Morse was an American inventor and painter. He invented the first successful electric telegraph in the United States. He is best known for inventing Morse Code, a system for sending telegraphic messages made up of short and long sounds to represent letters and numbers.

1942 - 2018



Stephen Hawking




Stephen Hawking

Thomas Edison



Wilbur and Orville Wright were two American aviation pioneers. They are best known for being the first to invent, build and fly the world's first successful motor-operated airplane. Their first flight lasted a mere 12 seconds!
